The team won the Big West regular season championship and the Big West Tournament, received a #14 seed in the NCAA Tournament, and made it to the Sweet Sixteen in the NCAA College Tournament.

Bryan also received the highest honors for his success on the field of soccer as a coach and player. He represented his country Jamaica as a national team youth player. He was appointed an Olympic Development Program coach for the USYSA West Region. He was also named California Youth Soccer Association Coach of the year. The club teams he has coached have been exceptional capturing many tournament titles and receiving national recognition.

His skills in time management are exceptional. Bryan displayed great professionalism to achieve all that he accomplished during his time.
